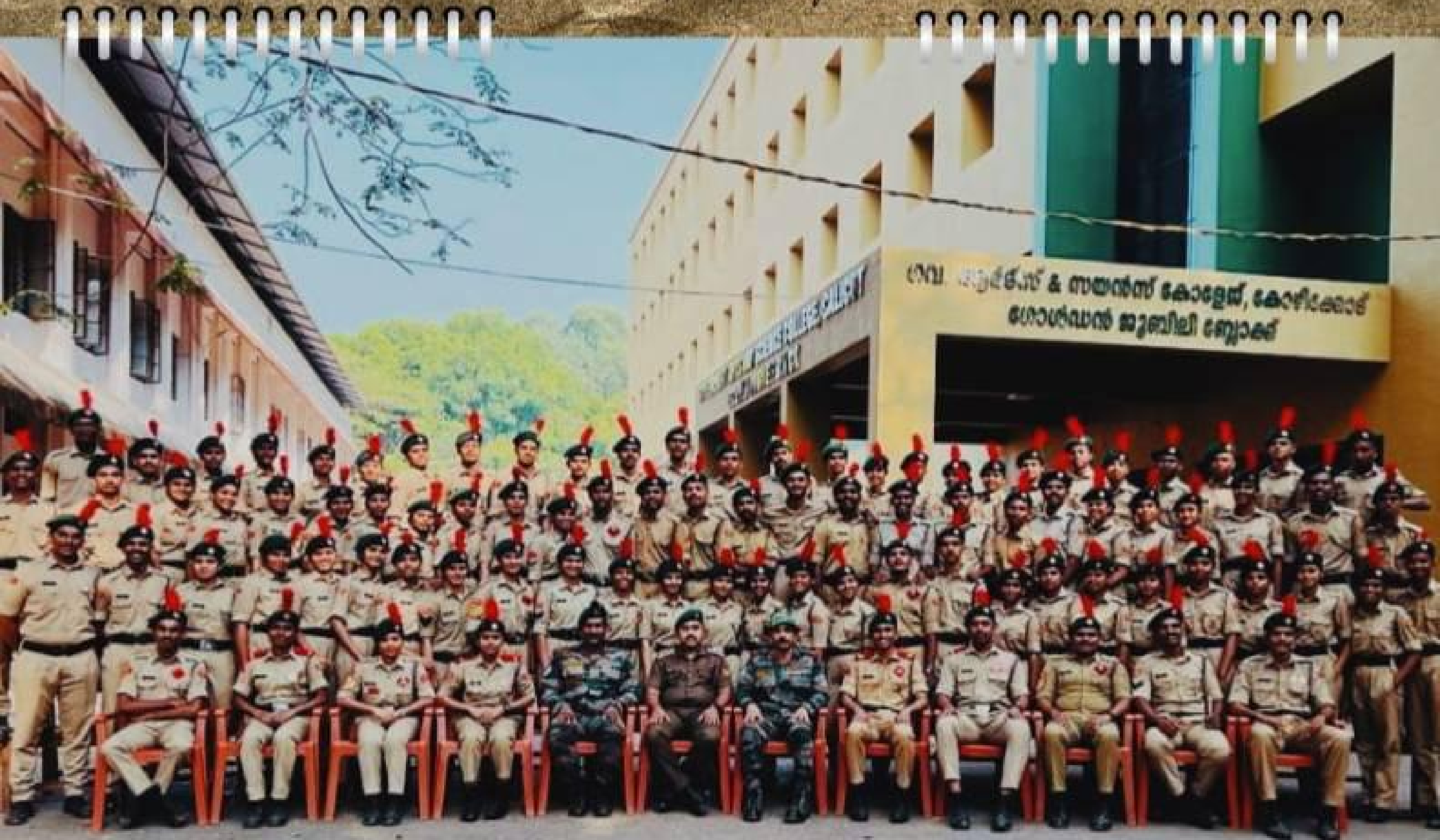

The NCC in India was formed in 1948. It can be traced back to the 'University Corps', which was created under the Indian Defence Act 1917. The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the youth wing of the Indian Armed Forces with its headquarters in New Delhi, India. It is open to school and college students on voluntary basis as a Tri-Services Organisation, comprising the Army, the Navy and the Air Force, engaged in developing the youth of the country into disciplined and patriotic citizens. The soldier youth foundation in India is a voluntary organization which recruits cadets from high schools, higher secondary, colleges and universities all over India. The cadets are given basic military training in small arms and drill. The officers and cadets have no liability for active military service once they complete their course.

THAL SAINIK CAMP

The TSC is a 12 days camp conducted by NCC in Delhi every year, in which the cadets are selected from all 17 directorates (30+3 cadets from each directorate), by the selection procedure conducting 3 pre-TSC camps each of 10–12 days a week interval. The cadets from different areas participate in this camp. There will be healthy competition between the cadets. The selected cadets are sent to the TSC to represent their respective directorates.

At first, the cadets were given a chance to participate in the obstacles and Firing in which the cadets should have good stamina and regular practice of pushups and running. Strength and speed make all the difference between the cadets. Other competitions like Judging distance, Health and hygiene, Field signals, Map reading, Tent pitching, and Line area have happened in the TSC camp, which will be a good experience for the cadets.

The cadets will be able to gain a lot of knowledge and self-confidence; they will be able to acquire leadership qualities. Attending a camp will teach the cadets to tackle different situations. Many games and cultural events have taken place during the camps, which will be ever-lasting memories for us. The overall camp experience makes the cadet learn punctuality, unity, and Discipline.

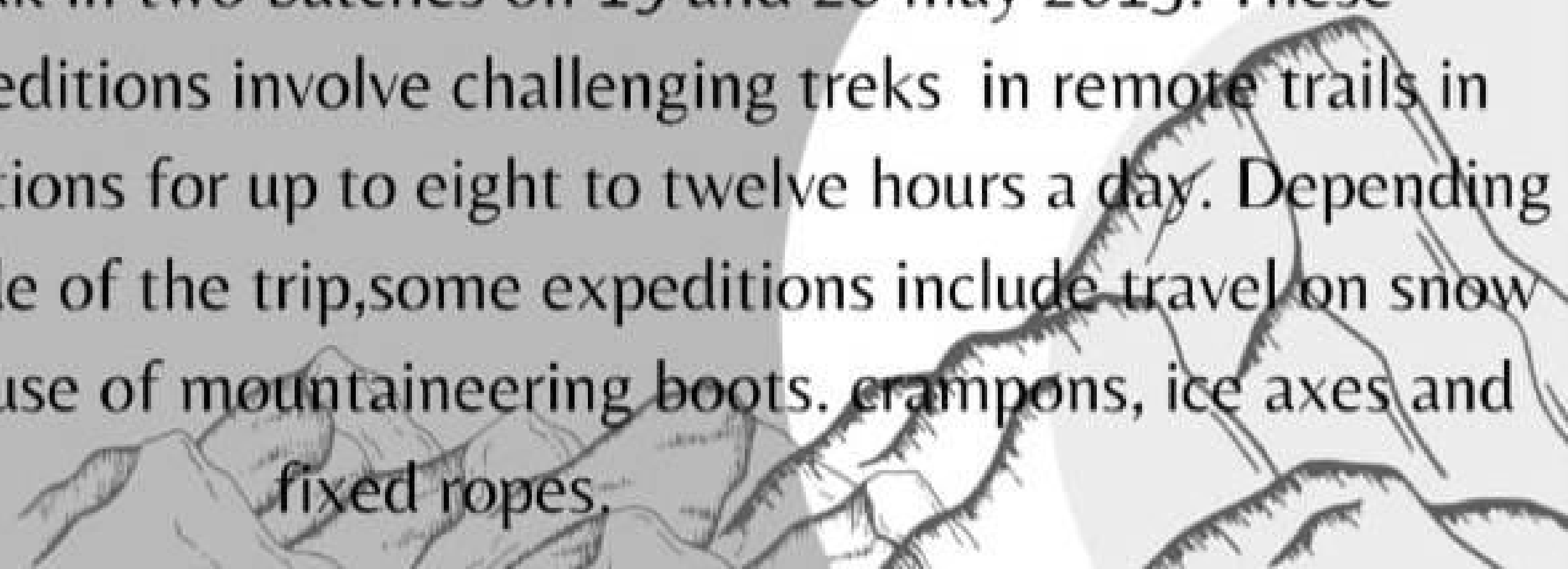
BASIC AND ADVANCED MOUNTAINEERING COURSE

It's a collection of a number of activities, be it physical, mental, social or even adventurous. This article would be centered around one such adventurous activity, Mountaineering/Trecking expedition.

NCC has been conducting two mountaineering expeditions every year, one each for the girl and boy cadets. Since 1970, the NCC has conducted 75 Mountaineering expeditions, of which 40 were for boys and 35 for girls. Mt Rudugaira (5819m), Mt Deo Tibba (6001m) and Mt Kamet (7746m) are some of the mountains that have been scaled by NCC cadets. History was created when the first ever Mt Everest expedition of NCC cadets (Boys) scaled the world's highest peak in two batches on 19 and 20 May 2013. These Mountaineering expeditions involve challenging treks in remote trails in variable weather conditions for up to eight to twelve hours a day. Depending on the region and grade of the trip, some expeditions include travel on snow and ice requiring the use of mountaineering boots, crampons, ice axes and fixed ropes.



COMBINED ANNUAL TRAINING CAMP

Combined Annual Training Camp or CATC is a compulsory camp conducted for all the cadets every year. These camps are held within the state under the aegis of respective NCC Directorates. The duration of this camp is usually held for 10 to 12 days. The main focus of this camp is to develop personality development and get a glimpse of military camp. The CATC is an essential part of the NCC training program, where cadets are exposed to a variety of activities such as physical training, weapon training, drill exercises, map reading, fieldcraft, and firing practice. The camp also provides an opportunity for cadets to interact with fellow cadets from different parts of the country, learn about their cultures, and build camaraderie. The aim is to instill discipline and a sense of responsibility among the cadets.

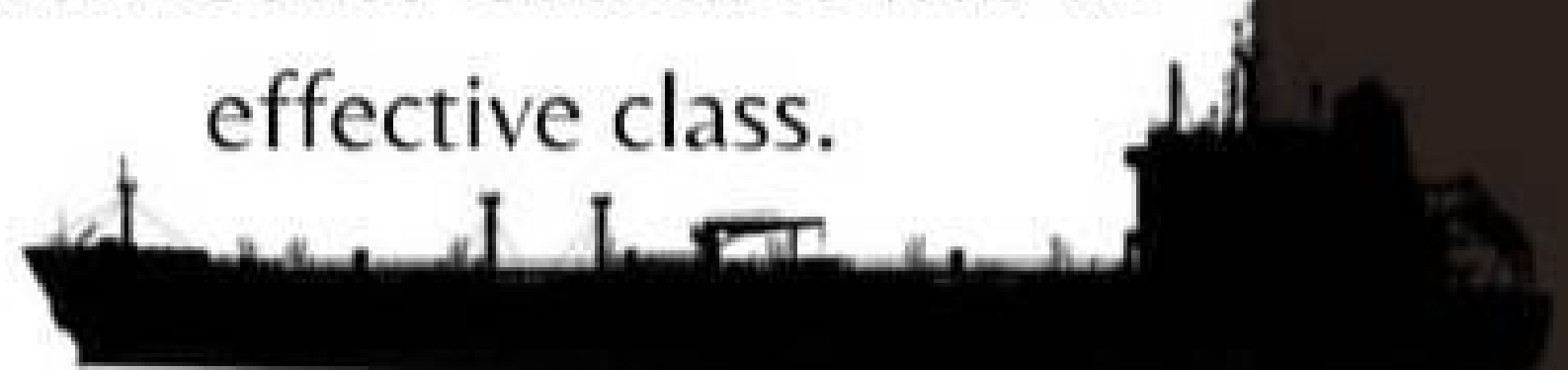
VISIT

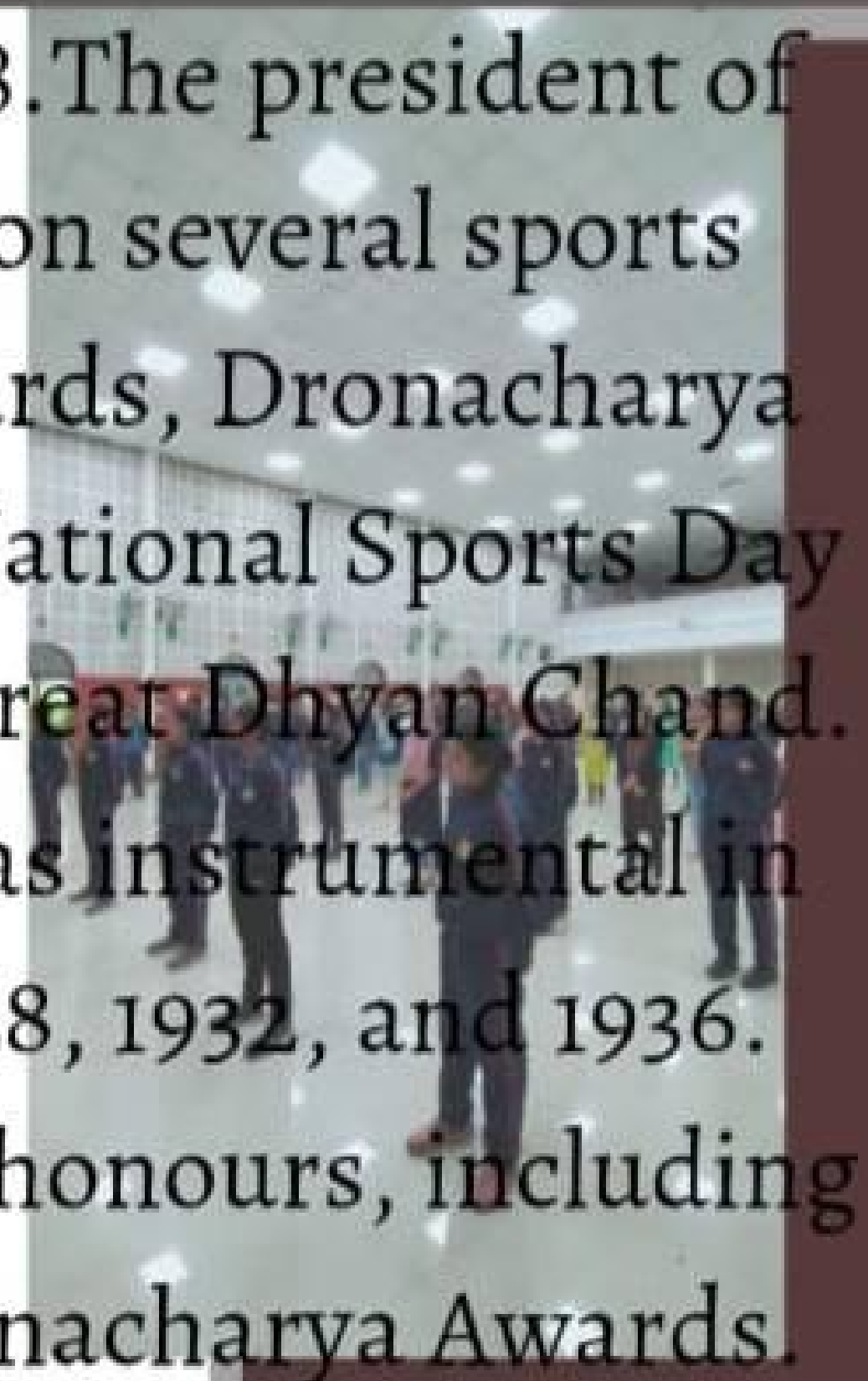
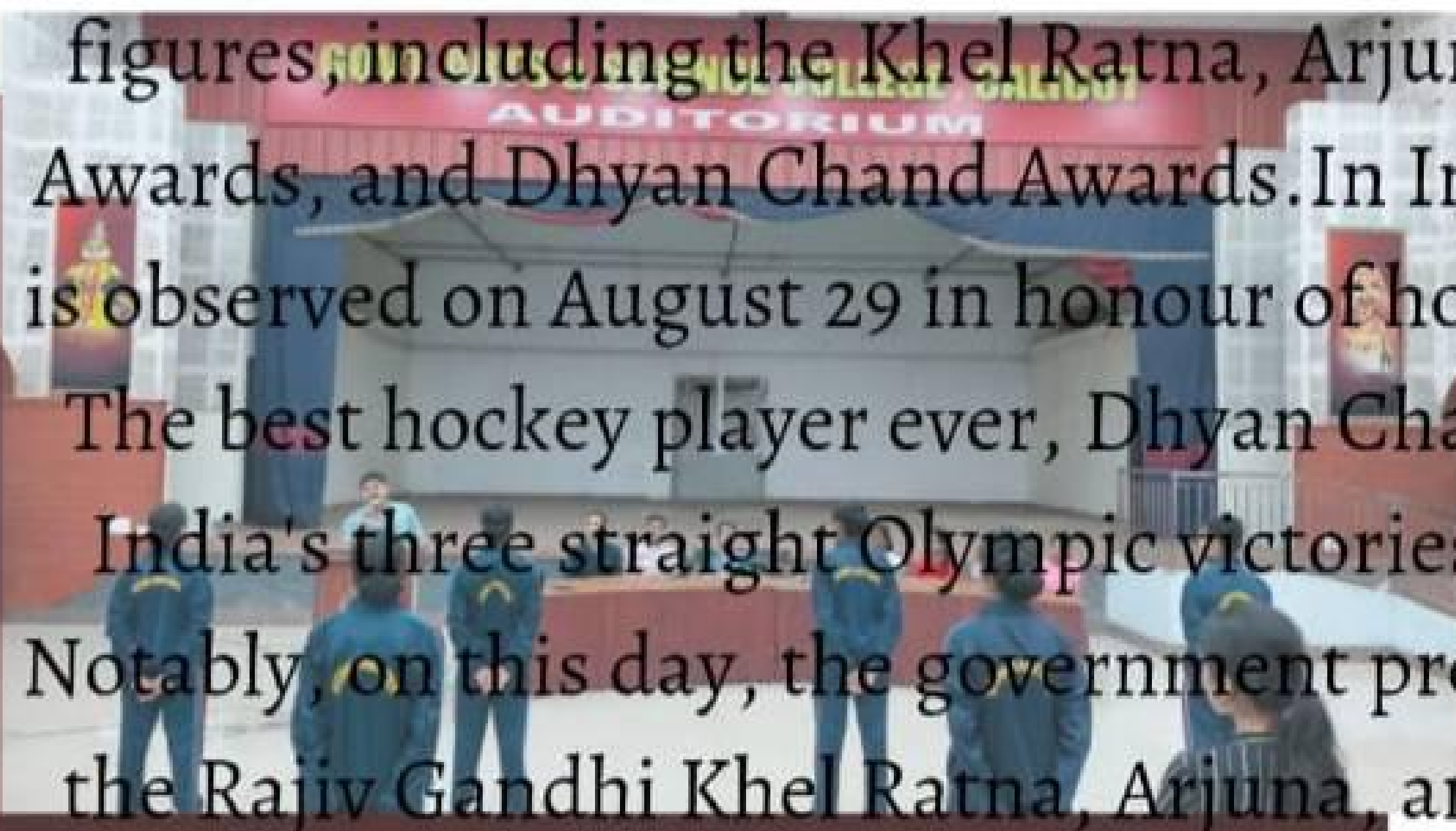
NATIONAL SPORTS DAY CELEBRATION

TREKKING

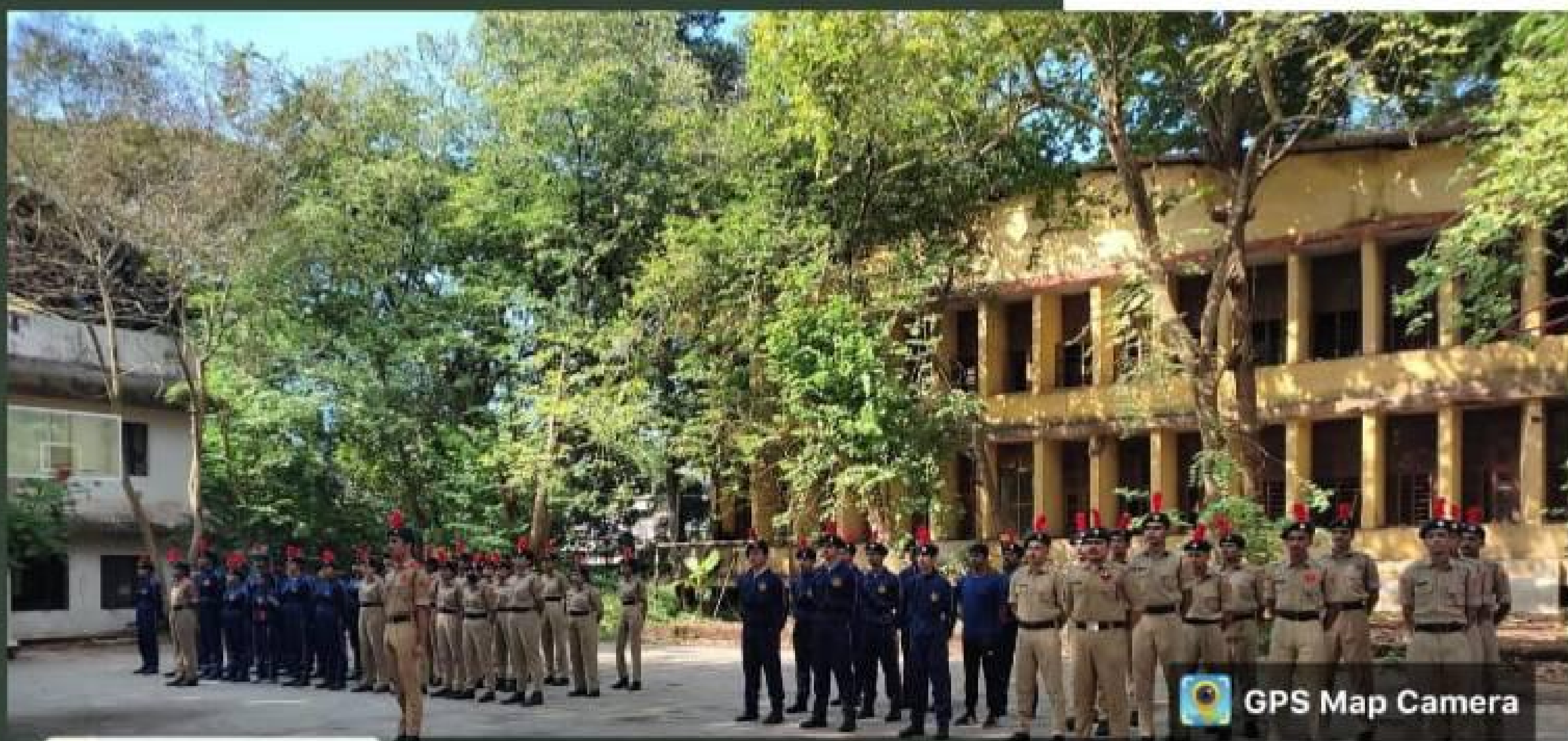

Surrounded by hills, tea plantations and lush green valley, Chembra Peak is the highest mountain peak in Wayanad. It is 2100 m above sea level. The place is protected by the forest department, and it has maintained its originality over the years. It is the ideal tourist spot if you're looking for a serene nature walk. Chembra Peak is a picturesque location from where you can get breathtaking views of the exotic flora and fauna of the region.

The forest department organises the Chembra Peak trek, which takes you through evergreen forests, waterfalls and lush greenery to a heart-shaped lake. The lake is bound to capture your heart at first sight. As per the beliefs, Goddess Sita took bath in the Chembra Peak lake. It is also said this lake has never dried.
