ANNUAL REPORT 2019-2020

The NCC unit of Government Arts and Science College, established in 1967 under 30 Kerala Battalion NCC is one of the oldest and prestigious units in the city. Functioning under the leadership of Associate NCC Officer Captain Sreejith K, (Assistant Professor Post Graduate Department of History) the unit has achieved remarkable heights in the past few years. The total cadet strength is 107, out of which 57 belongs to the Senior Wing (girls) and 50 to the Senior Division (boys). In 2019- '20 academic year, the unit was led by a team of excellent cadets headed by SUO Gayathri Kezhepat. UO Aswin E and UO Nimmi Nelson were the Under Officers for the Senior Division and Senior Wing respectively. CSM Muhammed Safwan and CQMS Jithin MV also handled the positions of Company Sergeant Major Company Quarter Master Sergeant.

The activities for the academic year 2019 - '20 was kicked off on 15th of August with the Independence Day celebrations. Principal Dr. S Jayasree hoisted the flag and addressed the gathering. Cadets cleaned the college and its premises which was then functioning as a relief camp due to the flooding. Government Arts and Science College Meenchantha was the largest functioning camp in the whole Kozhikode district and NCC cadets played an important role in the smooth conduction of the camps by their selfless service in all the matters. The team was led by SGT Janak K and their work was highly appreciated. On 26th July , Kargil Vijay Diwas was observed in order to commemorate the victory of Kargil War. Programs were conducted from the residence of the great martyr, Captain Vikram. Cadets also took part in the International Yoga Day Program held at JDT Islam Campus, Vellimadukunnu. A speech competition was also conducted by the NCC unit in connection with Malala Day which several students apart from cadets enthusiastically participated. A rank assignment ceremony and parade were conducted on 24th August 2019. Many of the senior cadets were promoted and the ranks were presented to cadets by Principal Dr Jayasree S. On 29th of August an honoring ceremony was conducted for UO Aswin E who had successfully participated in Mavlankar shooting Camp, which is regarded as one of the prestigious camps in NCC. On 20th August, cadets performed Cane Guard for DCE on his visit to the College. Reinforcing the spirits of brotherhood and companionship cadets celebrated Onam on 7th September . ANO Captain Sreejith K delivered the onam message. An essay writing Competition was organized by the unit for all the students on 1st October, in connection with the Gandhi Jayanthi Day. The program was noted for the active participation of students. On 2nd October cadets undertook the cleanliness drive as two teams. One team cleaned the premises of college and the other team participated in the cleaning program conducted by 30 K BN and cleaned Garudan Kulam near Vikram Maidan. On 5th October cadets got another opportunity to perform Cane Guard for Excise Minister TP Ramakrishnan. From 6th to 8th October cadets stayed back at college for the purpose of painting and renovating the College Auditorium. The

willingness and enthusiasm of cadets in conducting such activities and supporting the college were highly appreciated by the teachers and staffs.

Senior Under Officer Gayatri Kezhepat has again made the unit proud by getting selected to attend the Youth Exchange Program at Kazakhstan as a delegate. Sergeant Muhammad Thanseef MP has successfully participated in the Thal Sainik Camp at Delhi and emerged as a proud winner in judging distance field signal. To commemorate this proud moment an honouring ceremony was held on 24th of October. This program was inaugurated by principal Dr Jayasree and presided by ANO Captain Sreejith K. The cadets also shared their camp experiences and motivated younger cadets to do the same. On 30th October cadets performed Cane Guard for Shri P Vijayan IPS, Inspector General of Police, on his visit to the college. On 3rd November cadets welcomed Hon'ble Speaker P Sreeramakrishnan by performing Cane Guard. Cadets took the initiative to clean Beypore Pulimood beach on 14th November. 23rd of November was a remarkable day as a honouring ceremony was conducted by the college for both NSS and NCC units for their achievements. Cadets welcomed Hon'ble Transport Minister AK Saseendran who was the chief guest by performing Cane Guard. On the same day Cadets also attended an awareness class organized alongwith the Jeevani centre on the topic of Mental Health. On 24th November cadets celebrated NCC Day by visiting Govt Childrens Home at Vellimadukunnu. Cadets interacted with the children, performed for them and presented Handmade cards.

The College Science Exhibition Quest 2019 was conducted on 5th, 6th, and 7th of December. Cadets worked with the committee and several departments day in and out to make the program a success. Cadets impeccably performed their duty to control the crowd very systematically and it really helped in the smooth conduction of the program. ON 7th Decmber cadets also participated in the Varakkal Beach Plogging organized by 30 Kerala Battalion and on 12th December took initiative for cleaning Thiruvachira pond. The unit organized a class on SSB and Motivation session for cadets who aspire to join the forces. The session was led by Indu Kezhepat who was an NCC Cadet and four times recommended for SSB with an All India Rank of 2. The session was indeed really helpful for all the aspirants. On 18 th January cadets attended the Indian Army Mela at Malappuram which helped them to gain knowledge on different aspects of the Indian Army. On the Republic Day on 26th January, contingent wise Parade competition was conducted in which four contingents showcased the marching skill and Alpha Contigent emerged as the winners.
